## **Executive Summary:**

MUK has been treated as envisioning of the society, which fosters harmonization with the larger community, culture and nature. To make the vision true, MUK works under five different programmatic outcomes as per its strategic plan 2020-2025. Currently, our work traces the lives of over 2 million beneficiaries across Bangladesh, through intervention in five broad development programs including (i) Governance, Democracy, Political Empowerment & Social Accountability, (ii) Peace & Tolerance, (iii) Women, Children and Disable Rights, (iv) Education Program and (v) Agriculture Development & Income Generating Activities(IGA) mark another successful year of performance.

MUK is transforming public institutions legitimate and effective. MUK try to ensure and promote universal human dignity by practicing of holistic cultural approach. It gradually adds values not just when these remain diverge, but when they actively are engaged in conflict and whether there is proof of strategies that work, in the long term if not in the short term. MUK facilitates to engage community, which belongs multiple people with different intra- religion and cultural back grounds keep their own tradition in a given peace process would take into consideration from the outset which contributes towards a pluralistic approach within community.

MUK's role is to enhance the agenda for numerous congregations in community to perform as a lens for decision-making around a process as a first step. Through intervening an inclusive process, in depend in gone the context, the main actors like, Religious leaders, Teachers, moreover Students as well youth community is included. Building resilience in peace process it is proven to be beneficial for other reasons, such as making governance mechanisms or institutions more effective and responsive, providing capacity, or addressing the concerns and grievances of constituencies that becomes important bottom of support.

MUK is bringing contextual changes through intervening by popular folk cultural in engaging community are showing ability to resolve existing problem of conflict within the community. Building peace consensus in enabling community to prevent MUK's program initiatives for respective age groups and professional groups bring engagement to be a willingness to embrace pluralism's value proposition: that diversity has approached in a positive way with the interests, values and participation of different groups being respected. It needs to mention here that MUK has added some new practices organizationally such as monitoring the development context in formal way collaboration with SCAN/CBR and use the information on programmatic areas, regular assess of check and balance practices within the organization through using monitoring & evaluation tools, trying to practice 'Do no harm' analysis in project planning stage.

For mainstreaming gender in the organization as well as social spheres, MUK's Gender Forum has been functioning independently for the promotion of women's rights within the organization with a separate Gender Plan. Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell is active towards an equitable co-relation among men and women within the organization and society.

## **Organizational Management**

### **Governance**

This is consisted of 21 members of the General committee and is also consisted 7 members of executive committee under MUK. The meeting of the executive committee is arranged every two months. The meeting of the General committee is arranged every two years. The day-to-day management of the organization is conducted by a senior management team led by Chief Executives.

### **Human Resource Management**

To MUKs' human resource management (last version), It is necessary to strengthen its capacity, commitment and professionalism to the challenges to implementing the 2020-2025 strategic plans. In 21-22 periods, currently, there is working 305 paid Staffs (about 40% of them are Women). There are also 225 volunteer teachers, who are involved to ensuring education for all. In addition, MUK is maintaining its duty as an implementer organization of the out of school children program under the Ministry of Education and mass communication, the People's Republic of Bangladesh.

### **Financial Management**

Financial capacity of the Organization: MUK has been handling funds for more than 27 years and in course of time has gained sufficient experience with handling project funds. At present, MUK operates 19 bank accounts in several banks for smoothly operational activities of each project and department including all projects. MUKs' financial management is maintaining national & international standards that have ensured the best utilize of resources and subject to rule. Some activities of Finance department that are carried out, which are given bellow.

## Audit System and Reporting

MUK has two auditing systems. The internal audit is conducted by internal auditors. They have submitted the report directly to the Chief executive officer. The fields are visited and also prepared quarterly reports for every project by the Auditors. The external Audit is conducted by the Chief executive officer and it is approved chief executive committee. MUK has enlisted famous Audit firms, and the reports those have recognized by national, international and also NGO affairs bureau.

## Inclusive Education treatment and rehabilitation of the person disabilities:

From the beginning, MUK operates this project prioritize. This project is implemented with the financial and technical assistance of CDD and the Jatio Protibondhi foundation. Childs' coeducation is included in 10 Primary disable school in 2021-2022 financial year. In order to rehabilitate, skill training on education, health, socio-economic condition and soft provided among the parents of 150 students under 2021-2022. Furthermore, in order to get admission to Govt. institutions and other centers, advocacy meetings has been arranged for special demand full children's. It has implemented awareness build-up activities for the need of special demand full children's through implementing 15 community meetings and 05 school seminars. In addition, disabled assistance materials like Wheel chair, stretcher etc, are provided. Statistical reports of 2021-2022, are given bellow.

## Initiative to create privilege to offer services to the neglected ageing people:

MUK has started this program by the assistance of Bangladesh NGO Foundation (BNF) in 2007. In the last financial year, this project has implemented successfully for the sake of neglected ageing Male & Female people. Furthermore, Primary As well as Primary health care services and regular monthly allowance have provided under the Project. Regular counseling's and cultural functions are turned to the ageing people centers in several times. 215 people from 150 families are enjoying human dignity in their respective families and communities. Numerical reports of implemented activities of this project, those are given bellow.

## Out of School Children Education programmme:

For the purpose of include 08-14 years of ages' out of school children and drop out school children's in the stream of mass education, for achieving the target, MUK is implementing this program all over the Meherpur district as an ISA member organization. This program is implemented by the Bureau of Non Formal education, (PEDP-4, Subcomponent-2.5) the Ministry of the Primary & Mass Education, The Government of the people's republic of



Bangladesh. 1302 Boys and 1098 girls, Total 2400 students are reading in the 70 non-formal education centers under Meherpur Sadar Upazila, 912 Boys and 712 girls Total 1633 students are studying in the 60 non-formal education centers under Mujibnagar upazila. Total 2320 students are studying in the 80 non-formal educations centers under Gangni upazila. 6150 students (08-17 years of age) are undercover all over the district in this program.

### Implemented activities:

1. It has implemented a Baseline survey.
2. This organization has arranged every monthly meeting.
3. It has complete Worker's engagement for survey and orientation.
4. It has been socially inaugurated and coordinates all levels of the community.
5. 03 Get-together meetings have arranged at upazila level.
6. 20 project supporting meetings have been arranged at the upazila level.
7. 210 CMC committees have formed and have provided orientation.
8. 210 Champaign committee have formed and have done meetings.
9. 420 Guardians meetings have been arranged.
10. Database operates file, rental agreement including other work have operated.

6150 learner are come out successful to class two from class one after completing the final exam. Furthermore, in according to Government high official visit not, this program is going in full swing.

### **Non Formal education and skill training:**

In order to mitigate risk full child lab ours' MUK is implementing education & skill training activities in the 22 & 55 no ward Dhaka City Corporation under agreement with 4<sup>th</sup> phase project office. 36 non formal education centers are operated by this project under the 2021-2022 financial year. 893 child lab ours' are studying in these centers. Every child has received two thousand taka in the two months. Gifts of 16,50,000 taka are provided among them. 36 teachers and supervisors are operating the education centers. There are formed a CMC



committee and also arrange a meeting. The training activities will start to add to skill from Jun 2022 for the sake of the next 06 months.

### **Child and woman rights advocacy:**

Ideologically, MUK has the soft corner on child & women's rights and as well as this organization has been implementing right - based activities in favour of children and women from the beginning. The violence against women committee is working closely against domestic violence in the three upazila under a district. A meeting has arranged with 04 groups. 250 children were present there. The main initiative is to make the children a



mini advocates. 350 women have received Advocacy training through 10 groups to develop themselves. During this reporting period, 05 GO-NGO coordination meetings, 12 women gatherings, 10 regional child forums were held and a women council was formed. This project has implemented various types of activities like School meetings, courtyard meetings and legal aid services.

### Primary health care and nutrition protect:

In 2015, MUK started health services and pain killer medicine distribution for the assistance of helpless, poor community peoples, which is funded by The Government of the people's republic of Bangladesh through the Ministry of Health and Family Planning. Disadvantages people and pain-affected families are became under health coverage to achieve common goals, this is funded Government jointly with MUK self-initiatives. This project program is reputed by all levels of the community people and also become in rich self respect. As a result, the organization has appointed to 02 physiotherapists, 01 assistant counselors and one assistant doctor for the purpose of ensuring quality health services. This health project is provided health services to the selected 1727 patients with the assistance of the Ministry of Health and Family Planning, Concern world and BNF. 75% of customers of them are come round from diseases.

### **ICS/Eco-friendly Improved Cook Oven Installation:**

In Bangladesh, the majority of the population relies on biomass for cooking and heating. About 99 % of the energy to meet household cooking needs comes from biomass sources. In previous times, effective steps are not taken against to prevent indoor air pollution despite of high use of biomass. Under consideration of health risks, MUK has promoted improved cook stoves and fuel conservation for domestic use by donor assistance.



In the interest of addressing both the health and energy problems associated with household cooking practices, MUK has found that the Improved Cook stove can save 50-60% of fuels compared with traditional ones and make the kitchen smoke-free. More than 75000 Improved Cookstoves have been installed under 2021-2022 financial years.

MUK has turned to expand its program at 3 upazilas in Meherpur district. The rural households of all these districts are using hand-constructed traditional mud cook stoves and suffering health hazards including acute respiratory infections. ICS project has been saving trees and has support to ensure rural women’s health. In the reporting period, MUK has produced and distributed 75000 nos. improved Chula/oven under 2021-2022.

The people of urban and rural areas are the most vulnerable to IAP from cooking Smoke exposure due to non-ventilated housing conditions. They are interested this cook stoves.

### **Quality Education for all ( RACE ) :**

It is well-known to all that Education is the Backbone of a Nation. Those countries are developed who are developed in education first. There is not a single country in the world that has developed them by ignoring educational development. Bangladesh governments have achieved enormous accomplishments in many sectors but cannot reach in educational target. Enrollment in



primary schools is highly satisfied but quality of education has gone down and the same time dropout rate is dreadful. To ensure quality primary education in Meherpur district, MUK has been implementing the above mentioned project from 2019 in Amjhupi, Pirojpur, Monakhali and Dariapur union under Meherpur Sadar Upazila. Through Community, Education Watch Group it is desired to ensure quality education in the schools. Functioning SMC, SLIP, SAC, PTA committees have started some activities like meeting with SMC, Guardians, UP standing committee members, watch group members, orientation, student council, lobbying teachers training, interface meeting, education fair. By supporting SEUDG members, schools prepared flower gardens in schoolyards, Annual budget, regular committee meetings and timely classes have implemented. Comparatively education quality is much better than before. Transparency and accountabilities in school Managements improved, rate of dropout declined, local people's involvements with primary school uplifted. Some activity have implemented in 2021-2022 financial year, in order to improve quality education, which are given bellow.

They want to rich in their anyway but anyhow and caught in the trap spread by the commission agents The rate of women and child trafficking is higher than in other district due to its geographical location. This district has a long borderline with West Bengal, India. To protect against human trafficking and rehabilitant the trafficking victims MUK has undertaken this project. Mass awareness building, Motivational Seminars, Skill development training, psychosocial counseling, door-to-door campaigns Courtyard meetings and lobbying rehabilitate are the main activities of the project. During the project duration 200 trafficking victim are identified, 50 victims received skill development training, 47 victims got self-employment opportunities and among them, 18 persons got shallow tube well and rice husking machine, 17 persons received funds for the grocery business, 3 victims participated in skill development 4 people got legal aid support, health support 2 persons and manufacture support to 3 masons. This project is financed by Relief International.

### **Vulnerable group development program(VGD):**

In order to save women from livelihood, food security, hard core poor, and hunger, this project was implemented by the Ministry of Women Affairs bureau, under the People's Republic of Bangladesh and with the assistance of MUK. Hardcore poor, disabled women, widow, and divorce women are the primary beneficiaries' of this project. The beneficiaries' of women received 30 kg Rice/Wheat per two years from this project. MUK has arranged training facilities in order to create income generating activities and raise funds. Because of MUK's involvement in this sector, corruption is also decreasing highly in this district. In the financial year 2020-2021, 1215 disadvantaged women receive services. VGD program is also implemented 02 upazilas under the Meherpur district by through MUK.

In order to ensure the good health of the people of the command areas of MUK, the above-mentioned project has been implementing from the foundation stage of the Organization. With the technical support of NGO – Forum Jessore, regional office, it is implementing its program since 2001. Courtyard meetings, school seminars, dramas, Jari songs etc were performed with the financial support of NGO Forum and Drink well international Bangladesh. In the reporting period, one water treatment plant is installed in village Beltolapara under Meherpur District by the financial support of Drink well International, Bangladesh. As a result, 3750 people of the area are consuming fresh and safe drinking water facility. Furthermore, survey work is going on in the Meherpur district for arsenic-free drinking water with the support of NGO Forum.
